Initial certification: 30 CE credit hours of M-TAC training/coursework Renewal certification: 15 CE credit hours of M-TAC training/coursework		
*Re-certification is required every 2 years for all tracks.

Additional Details

Applications for certification, including all documentation, must be submitted through the <u>online application form</u>.

Education and Professional Requirements

MA PGS – open to professionals with an associate's degree or high school diploma who are working in the recovery/addiction support field.

MA PGS I – open to bachelor's degree counselors or master's/doctoral degree non-licensed clinicians who are working in the addiction treatment field.

MA PGS II – open to licensed clinicians with a master's/doctoral degree. The licensure to achieve this level must be directly related to providing clinical treatment.

Prior Supervision Requirements

This is a requirement for both first-time applicants and renewals.

Please provide a letter from your current or past supervisor stating that you have received the required amount of addiction-related supervision.

Ongoing Supervision Requirements (MA PGS II only)

** This requirement is not applicable if the applicant currently works as a clinical supervisor or an independent practitioner in private practice. In this case, please provide a letter from your place of employment certifying your role, or a copy of your independent license showing that you are in good standing.

*** If the applicant is not receiving clinical supervision relative to problem gambling treatment, submission of a letter confirming ongoing supervision for other addiction-related casework is required.

What to include in the supervision letter:

 A description of the applicant's direct contact with supervision related to gambling disorder and/or addiction cases. Group or individual supervision is applicable, however time spent in staff or administrative meetings will not be considered.





- A description of the supervised work position and work setting/program during the clinical supervision.
- The supervisor's signature and/or sign-off on the supervision.
- The supervisor's professional qualifications.

CE Requirements

PLEASE BE ADVISED:

Training, coursework, and continuing education (CE) credits external to the M-TAC and PBU programs will not be accepted toward the fulfillment of MA PGS certification requirements. *

Applicants cannot count repeated courses for credit (e.g. attending the same course multiple times).

CE credits must be earned within 2 years from the time of application. The field is rapidly changing, and it is therefore critical for professionals to have current information.

*CE credits received from attending the DPH Office of Problem Gambling Services (OPGS)'s Annual Conferences are applicable and will be accepted toward the fulfillment of certification requirements.
